
WSFWI WIs hold their Annual Meetings in February & March, and I wanted to emphasise the value of making this a special meeting. Members are often put off attending, but it is a chance to reconnect with your WI, listen to the report of the year's activities, and look forward to the coming WI year. We do advise not having a speaker for your Annual Meeting, so that you can hold the "business" part without rushing, it is after all a requirement of our constitution, in the same way as every charity and organisation must do. Maybe have some special refreshments, afternoon tea perhaps, or Fish n Chips, and if you have visitors, it is a chance to showcase your WI to them - just make sure you welcome them with a brief explanation of what will happen. As I said last month, we will try and attend as many AMs as we can, and I have already been asked to go along to a few, some with concerns, some just wanting to have an enjoyable meeting. Please let us know and invite one of us along.

This is an outline of how your AM should proceed:

How to hold an Annual Meeting - shortened extract from the WI Handbook on MyWI

A new WI must hold an Annual Meeting within 15 months of formation.

Established WIs must hold an Annual Meeting once in every calendar year, in West Sussex they will be in February & March

and should be announced to the members in the programme.

The following should be done in preparation for the Annual Meeting:

- A statement of accounts for the last financial year must be independently examined by the IFE.
- Nominations for the committee can be taken up to the meeting, and it is advisable to seek more nominations than there are places on the committee and there must be a minimum of three committee members.
- If an election is to be held the WI Secretary arranges two tellers, usually members of a neighbouring WI, WI Advisers, or other people independent to that WI (e.g. Federation trustees).
- The WI Secretary prepares the agenda for the Annual Meeting and the Annual Report for presentation to the committee for approval.

Committee elections:

- If there are many more nominations than places on the committee, an election should be held, however please remember it is always better to have more help, so if there are only a couple of nominations welcome them onto the committee with open arms!
- Nominations for committee elections may also be accepted from the floor on the day. Such nominees should be asked their willingness to stand and eligibility to become a charity trustee.
- Committee elections must be held by secret ballot, which can be held first so that the voting is completed before the start of the Annual Meeting.
- Only WI members who have paid the relevant subscription for the year and are present at the Annual Meeting may vote.
- Once a result has been reached, the committee is announced to the members and any new committee members only take office once the Annual Meeting has ended.

Annual Meeting business:

- Before the start of the Annual Meeting business, the President should ask if everyone present has voted and, if so, declare the ballot closed.
- The President chairs the Annual Meeting, only handing over the chair to the WI Adviser or tellers during the election for a new President.
- The committee must present the Annual Report. Adoption of the report is proposed by the President and no seconder is required. Members vote by show of hands.
- The committee must present the signed statement of accounts. Adoption of the accounts is proposed by the Treasurer and a seconder is required. Members vote by show of hands.
- The financial statement is presented by the Treasurer. Copies of the statement should be available to members. A copy of the reconciled bank statement should also be on display for members to view.
- The committee recommends the appointment of the IFE for the following year. This is proposed by the Treasurer. Members vote by show of hands.

Election of the WI President:

- This is conducted by a WI Adviser, if present, or by the tellers.
- The members of the newly elected committee are announced.

- Each WI member should be handed a slip of paper and asked to nominate the committee members she would like to see as President for the coming year.
- Each nominee is then asked to indicate in writing whether she is willing to stand for election.
- All members then vote in writing choosing between those willing to stand for election.
- Voting papers are collected and counted by the tellers and the result announced. In the event of a tie, the vote is continued until one person is elected.
- If a committee member is absent from the Annual Meeting but is willing to be nominated for election to any office, she should state her willingness in writing in advance.
- If a new President is elected, she does not take office until the Annual Meeting has ended.

The use of secret ballots is vital to the democratic nature of the WI and gives every member the chance to support fellow members in standing for a position such as President. It all seems dauting when you have done it, but we can help and support you through. If you are a shareholder in any organisation, you will know that similar meetings take place each year.

Please fill the forms you were sent with the December WSN as soon as possible after your Annual Meetings and send them back to the federation, this helps us have the most up to date information about each WI. Also make sure your MCS rep has all the information so that she can keep the MCS up to date.

The telephone has also been temporarily transferred to the Federation Chair's mobile, but we will have a new number soon. I hope you have all voted for your favourite resolution, the deadline is February the 11th.



Looking further ahead we have booked **Ashington Village Hall for a**



March is Ovarian Cancer Awareness month. So now might be a good time to get going with creating the panty bunting some of us put up last year to highlight the WI campaign of See The Signs (of ovarian cancer).

Last year Erika Brichta, the WSFWI Chair, festooned Storrington with the bunting and was featured in the local papers. Bunting was also put up other parts of the county including in Horsham, Felpham, Rustington and East Preston. In my WI, we cut out cardboard panties, which we decorated and then formed into bunting. We displayed it in local libraries, hairdressers and a doctor's surgery along with information about the signs of ovarian cancer. As Erika, said last year "if we can save just one life, it will be worth it."

According to Cancer Research UK, there are around 7,500 new ovarian cancer cases in the UK each year, and 4,200 deaths.

It is one of the most common types of cancer in women, mainly affecting those



who have been through the menopause.

Although the risk of developing ovarian cancer increases with age, there are cases in younger women so all women must know the symptoms to look out for. On average, 1,330 women under the age of 50 are diagnosed with ovarian cancer every year in the UK.

The earlier ovarian cancer is diagnosed the easier it is to treat. However, because the early signs of ovarian cancer are similar to conditions such as irritable bowel syndrome (IBS), and premenstrual syndrome (PMS), it is often not diagnosed until it has spread and a cure is not possible.

Overall awareness of the symptoms of ovarian cancer remains low, yet this is crucial to early diagnosis, alongside other factors such as healthcare professionals taking the necessary steps when women present with them.

Everyday 11 women die of this disease we want to encourage women to seek early diagnosis and not to ignore: persistent stomach ache, difficulty eating/feeling full more quickly, persistent bloating and needing to wee more frequently.

If you or a loved one experiences one or more of these symptoms and they are persistent and increasingly frequent or a change that isn't normal for you, speak to your GP.


