Ever notice how fashion trends change at lightning speed? While I am sure that many of you hold onto your clothes for a long time, the UK is one of the biggest consumers of clothing in the world.

Okay, so we all love a good bargain, but those super affordable clothes are taking a toll on the environment? Fast fashion's quick production cycles mean more resources are used, leading to water pollution and a mountain of textile waste. The materials used are often not top-notch, contributing to a hefty carbon footprint. And don't get us started on those synthetic fabrics that stick around forever because they just won't biodegrade

Ever wondered where your old clothes end up? A lot of them end up in landfills. In the UK, we're dealing with a whopping 350,000 tonnes of clothing waste every year. With not enough people recycling their old clothes properly, we're facing a serious waste problem that's harming the environment.

You may think that by donating your unwanted clothes to Charity shops or by putting in the donation bags that continually come through the door you are helping. However that is simply moving the problem to another part of the world. Ghana, for example, receives 1.5 million tonnes of textile waste from beyond its borders every year. This textile waste then pollutes their water systems.



So, there you have it - the not-so-friendly side of fast fashion in the UK. But fear not! There are steps we can take to make a positive change. Instead of grabbing that must have bargain that you wear once and then sits in your wardrobe for the rest of year before being donated, consider how many other items in your wardrobe it will go with. Try to buy fewer, higher quality items. Hold a clothes swap. Research shows that restricting buying to only eight new clothing items per year reduces supply chain waste by 50% Pre loved clothing does not count towards these totals.

We will be using this column to show you how to repair the clothes you already have, to keep them in use for longer. The most environmentally friendly purchase is the one you DON'T buy.

The WI plays a crucial role in supporting and empowering women in various aspects of their lives, and addressing domestic violence is no exception. WSFwi had planned on attending the Million Women Rise March. The NFWI has decided to withdraw WI attendance at this march but is holding a day-long event in London on the same day – details of this at the end of this article.

Two women are killed each week by a current or past partner, and one in four women will experience domestic abuse.

One of the main ways the WI can help victims of domestic violence is by raising awareness about the issue. We can organise events to educate our members about the signs of domestic violence, its impact on victims, and available resources for support.

By fostering open conversations, the WI can contribute to breaking the silence surrounding domestic violence and reducing the stigma associated with seeking help. Why not invite someone from a Women's Refuge to talk at one of your meetings?

The WI can also organise fundraising initiatives to provide financial support to local organisations working directly with victims of domestic violence. The economic situation has affected everywhere, and many refuges have suffered cuts in their grants. If you are unable to help financially, you could ask a Women's Refuge if there are other ways you can support them.

WI holds a unique position to make a substantial impact in supporting victims of domestic violence. Through raising awareness, and fundraising efforts, the WI can contribute to creating a safer and more supportive environment for people affected by domestic violence. By fostering a culture of empathy, understanding, and empowerment, the WI can play a crucial role in breaking the cycle of abuse and building a society that prioritises the well-being of all its members.

There may still be some places on the event that replaces the Million Women Rise march on March 9th explaining how the WI can support women affected by violence. WSFwi has several members going up by train and you would be welcome to join us.

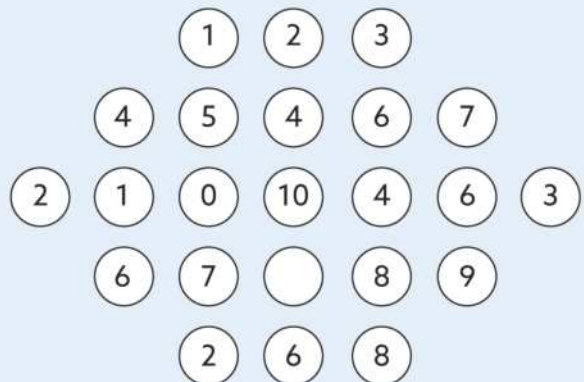

Cookery Corner

HOT CROSS BUNS

These lightly-spiced, fruity Easter buns are perfect for a spring afternoon tea.

Information

Makes: 4 buns
Prep time: 30 mins plus 2 hours proving
Cooking time: 10 mins

Ingredients

- 175g (6oz) strong plain bread flour, plus 25g (1oz) for topping
- 1 tsp mixed spice
- 1 large pinch ground cinnamon
- Finely grated zest ½ lemon
- 1 tsp fast-acting dried yeast
- 100ml (4fl oz) skimmed milk, plus extra for brushing
- 15g (1 tbsp) reduced fat spread
- 1 egg yolk
- 75g (3oz) sultanas or other dried fruit
- Vegetable oil for greasing

Method

1. Put the 175g (6oz) flour, spices, cinnamon, lemon zest and yeast into a medium bowl.
2. In a small saucepan, or in the microwave, gently heat the milk and fat together until the fat has melted. Cool until tepid then whisk in the egg yolk.
3. Add to the dry ingredients and mix to a soft dough with your hands. Tip the dough out on to a lightly floured work surface and knead in the sultanas. Lightly knead for 10 minutes until silky and elastic and shape into a smooth ball. (If you prefer, you can do this stage in a food processor with a dough hook.)
4. Lightly oil a bowl and drop in the dough. Cover with cling film and leave to rest in a warm place for about 1½ hours or until doubled in size.
5. Turn the dough out on to a lightly floured surface once more and divide into 4 balls. Line a baking tray with baking paper and place the balls in a tight square and flatten them slightly.
6. Cover with oiled cling film and leave for 30 minutes, or until the buns have doubled in size.
7. Heat the oven to 220C, 200C fan oven, Gas 7. Mix the remaining 25g flour to a thick paste with water. Put into a piping bag or the corner of a small plastic food bag.
8. When the buns have risen, brush lightly with milk and pipe a cross on each one. If using a food bag, snip the corner off the bag to leave a small hole for piping.
9. Bake the buns for about 15 minutes or until pale golden-brown, turning the baking tray round halfway through if they are not cooking evenly. Cool on a wire rack.

Any dried fruit can be used, such as dried cherries, apricots or figs, but make sure they are chopped into small pieces.

For a shiny, sticky finish, dissolve 1 tsp caster sugar in 3 tsp of warm water and brush over the cooked buns.

Fill the Empty Circle Solution
