

## **WSN PHOTOGRAPHIC** COMPETITION RESULTS







We are delighted that Lesley Thomson, award winning Crime Author and MA Creative Writing tutor at West Dean College, will tell us about writing her novels.

In her talk "Write what you know - if you don't know find it out!", Lesley will discuss the research she has done over the years, including riding in the cab of a District line underground train to visiting the 19th century herbarium at Kew Gardens and seeing a specimen filed by Charles Darwin.

Lesley Thomson's novels include 2010 People's Book Prize winner A Kind of Vanishing, the no. 1 bestselling series The Detective's Daughter, which has sold over 850 million copies, and her recent novel The Mystery of Yew Tree House, which was in The Times top ten for 2023. Lesley is currently writing the tenth in The Detective Daughter's series.

200 members attended Not the Annual Meeting at Worthing's Pavilion Atrium at the end of March.

Ruth Rogers demonstrated how she convinced the audience, at the War Horse stage play, that the puppets were real. Primarily, the horse puppets' emotions and sight lines were delivered by movements of the ears. Ruth's manipulation of her hands, legs, feet and body lead some of us to believe she was a horse!

The RNLI volunteers presented the history of the boats used to save lives at sea. The first boats were wooden and powered by men rowing, putting their own lives at risk in what could only be











described as an extreme sport! In RNLI's 200th year, we heard how women are a growing force within their organisation, with more women taking on roles as crew members and winning awards.

Margaret Watson delivered her presentation by asking and answering questions about playing the Harp and what had inspired her. # **CLIMATE AMBASSADORS**

This column is for West Sussex WI Climate Ambassadors to share how we can act to help our planet. If you are a Climate Ambassador and would like to contribute please send your ideas to the above email address.

Without wanting to teach my grandmother how to suck eggs, I have discovered that some simple repair skills are not known to everyone. With that in mind I have been explaining how to keep your current wardrobe in service for longer. You could share the information with family members who may not be as skilled as yourselves.



Sewing on a button might seem like a tiny task, but it's a handy skill to have in your DIY arsenal. Here are the steps on how to do it:

- 1 Gather Your Gear: Grab a needle, some thread (ideally matching the button and fabric), and of course, the button itself.
- **2 Thread the Needle:** Double up your thread for extra strength and tie a knot at the end.
- 3 **Position the Button:** Place the button where it needs to go and hold it in place with a pin or your fingers.
- 4 **Start Stitching:** Push the needle up through the fabric from the backside, then through one of the buttonholes. Pull it tight, but not too tight you want a little wiggle room for the fabric.
- **5 Repeat:** Keep sewing through the fabric and buttonholes, making a little X pattern underneath. Aim for about four to six stitches, depending on the size of your button.
- **6 Secure it:** Once you're done sewing, flip the fabric over and make a few extra stitches to secure the thread. Tie it off with a knot and trim any excess.

Voila! Your button is securely in place, ready to keep your clothes looking sharp. Sewing on a button is a quick fix that can save your favourite shirt from retirement - so give it a try!

Remember the most environmentally friendly purchase is the one you DON'T buy.



# BRAMBER BEECHES OUR FEDERATION'S WOODLAND

Greening Steyning, under their Nature Mapping Scheme, is running a survey at Bramber Beeches from May. Their experienced volunteers will be working with a local woodland expert, and will keep our Federation and the landowners informed about any findings.

The decision from the South Downs National Park Authority, about our grant application to replace the fencing, gate and bench, and adding a new Bramber Beeches sign is imminent. We are waiting



optimistically, and will share the news as soon as we can. Meantime, the replacement seat is getting underway. A local sawmill is supplying the wood from a piece of oak that fell in the 1987 storm. It is great that our new bench is part of local history – and good use is being made of the wood after its tragic loss to the area.

#### Picnic and Walk

To mark the occasion of a new seat, the gateway and signage, there will be a Walk and Talk Event on Saturday 13 July 2024, at 11.00am until 2pm, starting from the field adjacent to the South Downs Way footpath at the top of Bostal Road, between Steyning and Lancing. Exact meet place details will be on the tickets.

The event, when we hope to be joined by representatives from South Downs National Park, Greening Steyning and others involved in our current project, is 2 miles. We will follow the South Downs Way footpath from our field car park to Bramber Beeches. There is a low

level, gradual hill, but no stiles. We will hear about the history of Bramber Beeches, conservation work and how these pockets of woodland are key to the environment. After taking in the wonderful view across Steyning from our woodland seats, we will return to our cars to eat our picnics. It is sensible to wear good walking shoes and clothing suitable for weather conditions on the day. It can be breezy on top of the Downs!

I have heard Emma Holland-Lindsay (Head of Pubic Affairs at NFWI) speak recently about how this is an important year for those who want to campaign for change. For a while the tables are turned, instead of us pushing on the door of those in power asking for their support, they are knocking on our doors asking



for our support. This is a great time to ask what they are prepared to do in return? How will they support the campaigns we are interested in? You may have seen on social media my suggestions for questions to put to the Police and Crime Commissioner candidates for Sussex? Unfortunately printing dates prevented me from getting the names to you via this column. In addition to the Police and Crime Commissioner elections we also have local council elections and most probably a General Election this year. I urge you to use your voting power, we are at the point between 100 years since some women got the vote in 1918 and 100 years since all women were able to vote in 1928. That power was hard won, please use it.

May 20th is World Bee day. Helping out bees in the UK is super important for keeping our gardens blooming and our crops growing. Here are some easy ways to lend a hand:

- 1 Plant Bee-Friendly Gardens: Fill your garden with flowers that bees love, like lavender, foxgloves, and heather. Go for native plants that bloom at different times to keep our buzzy friends happy all year round.

- 4 Give Them a Home: Set up a bee hotel or leave some bare ground for solitary bees to nest. These little guys are awesome pollinators, and they'll appreciate a cozy spot to call home.
- 5 Spread the Word: Tell your friends and family about the importance of bees and how they can help. The more people know, the more we can do to protect our buzzy buddies.
- 6 Get Involved: Join local conservation groups or beekeeping associations to lend a hand. You can volunteer for bee-related projects and learn interesting facts about bees along the way.



7 Speak Up: Support policies that protect bees and their habitats. Let your voice be heard in favour of banning harmful pesticides and promoting sustainable farming practices that help bees thrive. Maybe raise the issue with your MP

With these simple steps, you can make a big difference in helping bees buzz happily along in the UK.
