It is essential that the MCS Rep keep this database up to date to ensure accurate communication and services. New members should be promptly added to the database, while those who have not re-joined should be removed. Additionally, Officer changes must be reflected to maintain accurate contact information as this is used to create the WSFWI Yearbook, a valuable resource for the WI community. The NFWI relies on the data in the MCS database to send out vital resources like WI Life magazine and the annual voucher booklets.

When you read this I will have left the Board of Trustees after seven interesting years as Chair of Sport and Leisure and more recently as Vice Chair of WSFWIs.



## **A NEW BEGINNING FOR WEST SUSSEX WI**

What have an 18th-century wheelwrights, an upholstery business and the new offices of West Sussex Federation WI got in common? The answer quite simply is that they all have occupied or are occupying the same space in Horsham, West Sussex.

Erika Brichta the current West Sussex Federation Chair recently opened the new WI offices in Queen Street, Horsham. The opening was attended by about 60 WI members including Jeryl Stone the WI National Chair and Melissa Green the WI National Chief Executive. Representatives of Horsham District Council and West Sussex County Council were also present. However the important most guests were the granddaughter and great granddaughter of Lady Denman, Mrs Greenwood and

Mrs Martin respectively. Lady Denman was the founding member of the WI movement in England in 1915. It was with their permission that the new offices are named Denman House.

The oldest WI in England, founded in 1915, is Singleton and East Dean and of their two members were also present. In her speech at the opening Erika Brichta explained why they had moved from North Lodge in Chichester where the WI West Sussex offices had been based for 76 years. The problem was that North Lodge "was a Grade 2 listed building which no longer served the needs of our membership. It is fair to say that we prevaricated for very many years before we took the plunge to sell and find something which was more suitable and here we are. It has been a tremendous

team effort, the Federation board officers and trustees who are all volunteers, have worked tirelessly to get to where we are today.

Huge thanks to all of them."

As expected from the WI the opening included the cutting of a celebratory cake and a glass of champagne. There

was also much discussion as to how West Sussex WI can continue to work with partners to take forward initiatives and campaigns.

There are over 3500 members of the WI in West Sussex with 21 WIs in the Horsham constituency alone. This is not the end of an era but rather the beginning of a new chapter for West Sussex WI.

It was a throw away remark, 'I don't suppose anyone will want to do this?' I said, after reading Pam's article in the September issue about The WI Week of River Action.


'I'd help, it is for the environment after all'. Several members were enthused. I emailed Tobias at NFWI, there was such a good response Earthwatch was short of testing kits. Hassocks WI was put on a waiting list. Then I received an email, the kits were in the post.

In Hassocks we have a Herring Stream it and its tributaries drain northwards from the Downs and join the River Adur near Twineham. We decided to carry out water testing at the confluence of two streams. It is easily accessible , popular with dogs and children. The results of the tests for Nitrates and

Phosphates were good. We emailed the results.

I received a thank you from the website and an invitation to repeat the testing next April.

## **BRAMBER BEECHES**



WSFWI is grateful to Greening Steyning who have helped maintain access to our federation planted woodland Bramber Beeches at Coombes Farm, this year. In addition, Greening Steyning's Biodiversity Action Group, led by Ronnie Reed, with guidance from Tony Whitbread, President of Sussex Wildlife Trust, undertook a Habitat Survey there.

The survey was carried out over a period of three months, from

April 2024 to July 2024, over 4 visits to Bramber Beeches.

The survey included:

- A Walk Over to identify areas to be sampled, and shrub and ground flora.
- 5 sample areas spread across Bramber Beeches where species were recorded in detail at ground, shrub and canopy layers.

#### • A bat and bird survey using an open air acoustic device.

The report illustrated that Sycamore was the most dominant tree species. Beech trees were in 3 of the 5 areas, with beech saplings in the shrub layer. Other tree species included Italian Alders, Black Popular and Pines.

Hawthorn and Elder were the most dominant shrubs. Dogwood was found on the northern slope of the wood and Field Maple was present where there was more open space and light.

The ground layer was a mixture of Wood Avens, Parsley, Hogweed, Nettles and Brambles, with the Brambles in all areas except the middle shaded area.

Moss and Lichens were recorded in all sample areas.

Further comments, and findings about the birds and bats will be covered in future WSN, as well as a comparison with the original tree species planted. Meantime, if anyone would like to know more about the survey please contact Jan Marsden on **janmarsden@wsfwi.co.uk** or **01243 864670**.

This November marks the start of the UN designated 16 Days of Activism Against Gender-Based Violence, beginning on the 25th. This issue is so serious that the government and police now view it as being on the same level as terrorism due to the immense harm it causes.



In West Sussex alone, 48,500 women and girls were attacked last year, with 21 tragic deaths since 2019. To raise awareness and promote the "No More Violence" campaign, we're holding a Candlelit Vigil in the Carfax, Horsham, on Monday, 25th November, from 6-7pm. Safe in Sussex, who support domestic violence victims, will be there, along with Katy Bourne, the PCC, and possibly John Milne, the new Horsham MP. We'll be remembering the victims of violence. We would love you to attend along with friends and family. Horsham railway station is just a 10 minute walk away, or the Park and Ride bus stop is adjacent to the Bandstand.

On Saturday, 30th November, we'll be back in the Carfax, encouraging men to sign the White Ribbon, Not in My Name pledge, a commitment to never condone or participate in violence against women.

The official colour for the 16 Days is orange - symbolising hope for a brighter future. Look out for the orange displays put together by WIs throughout the community. Let's come together to create change!
