

All our WIs will now be planning for their Annual Meetings, due to take place in either February or March. The M&T team along with the Trustees hope that you use your Annual Meeting as a way of reviewing your WI year, looking back on all you have enjoyed and achieved, and looking forward to the new WI year.

WIs sometimes say to us that no one is interested in the AM, but we know that many members do enjoy this meeting, and if you plan a little it will interest all your members and prospective members as well.

Points to consider for your AM:

- Finances your treasurer, with the committee will have closed the books at year end and will have engaged with one of our IFEs to have the books examined. Please contact the treasurer's helpline if you need any further help with this. Although it is the committee who oversee the finances, all members should be aware of a WI's financial situation, too little and some fundraising should be planned, too much and the WI should consider how it can benefit the members, an educational trip perhaps, or some different speakers. It is usual to have a copy of the summary accounts available to all members for the meeting.
- Planning the meeting please don't book a speaker for your AM, allow plenty of time for the reports and the review, and then have some social time at the end. You could organise some special refreshments for your members. Ask for nominations or volunteers in advance of the meeting to ensure your have a viable committee going forward.

stepping down, and hopefully new members will step up to help. New ideas and input are always needed. Also, your officers may be looking to retire, so succession planning is crucial, as without your officers a WI is vulnerable and may have to suspend. Let members know that any help they can offer is welcomed, and look to share all roles and responsibilities, the more the better, within reason for your size of WI.

On the day - follow a simple agenda:

- 1) Welcome the members
- 2) Give them an outline of what will happen some may be new and not experienced an AM before.
- 3) The President will chair the meeting and introduce the various reports, Finance, given by the treasurer, Committee or Annual report, given by the secretary, and the President's report.
- 4) If enough committee members are willing to stand an election may not be required - all help is gratefully received!
- 5) President's Nomination roles in the WI are for one year, and each year the President will need to be nominated from those members of the committee willing to stand. Those willing to stand should state this in writing, in advance, especially if they cannot attend the AM. Each WI member, including the committee and officers should be given a slip of paper, and can nominate who they would like to see as President from those willing to stand. The nominations are counted, by an Adviser or Trustee if present, or maybe a member from another WI, and the person with the most nominations is named as the President for the coming year and takes over at the end of the meeting.

It is important to hold this nomination process to give your members their democratic right to choose their president.

We hope that you will find this information useful and will have a successful AM. Some of us are already going to Ams where WIs have requested an Adviser to be present, and some Trustees are also attending. If you are not anticipating any issues that's great, but if you would like some extra support for your AM, please let us know as soon as possible, and one of us will endeavour to attend.

The Science groups are continuing with great success and many new attendees. The next meeting will be on - Friday 28th February, 1pm-3pm, at Denman House. Speaker to be confirmed.

February is the month for the Show the Love Campaign. This is when we show our love for the environment. There are many ways you can do this, from organising a litter pick to reducing how much carbon your lifestyle generates. Every little helps as they say. If you have a new MP, perhaps you could make a green heart for them and ask to discuss ways in which the government can help love our environment.

By now, you will have made your choice about which resolution you would like to be put before the membership in June. This is a unique aspect of the WI: We campaign on matters chosen by our members. One campaign you chose was to raise awareness of Ovarian Cancer.

Ovarian cancer is a significant health concern in the UK, with approximately 7,500 women diagnosed annually. This equates to about one woman receiving a diagnosis every hour. The disease predominantly affects older women, with around 82% of cases diagnosed in those over the age of 50.

Survival rates for ovarian cancer vary significantly depending on the stage at diagnosis. Approximately 95% of women survive for five years or more when detected at the earliest stage. However, survival rates decrease substantially with later-stage diagnoses; for instance, only about 15% of women diagnosed with stage IV survive for five years or more.

Early detection is crucial, as two-thirds of women are diagnosed at a late stage, making treatment more challenging. Raising awareness about the symptoms and encouraging prompt medical consultation can improve early diagnosis and survival outcomes.

I hope you can see how important it is for us to raise awareness about the symptoms of this disease. March is Ovarian Cancer Awareness Month. Perhaps you are able to put out bunting that grabs attention and gives information about the symptoms. If you are unable to put out the bunting, you could ask if you can put a card with this information where it will be seen by women. We have been able to have a card in John Lewis' toilets in Horsham for the past year.

If you enjoy the campaigning aspect of the WI please consider joining our team. We meet over Zoom and you would be very welcome to observe one of our meetings.

I wish to thank you all for leading by example and changing your everyday lives to encompass environmental change. No matter how small, this makes a difference. My passion is reducing plastic pollution. As a Climate Ambassador I started the WI Green Hub stall in the Chichester Farmers Market supported by volunteers from Eco-Chi. With Eco-Chi we have broadened the stall information to include Trees & Bio-diversity, Renewable Energy, Waste & Recycling, Sustainable Travel, and Water Pollution.

I started the WI Plastic Free Picnic at Oaklands Park behind the Festival Theatre, in the Covid year of July 2020, with the first Information Table - Refuse, Reduce, Re-fill, Re-use and Recycle Plastic. Together with this and other plastic-free work, I helped Chichester to be given Plastic Free status in 2021. In support, Chichester District Council funded the commission of Mike Fry and the Plastic NoNo Band to compose and record the song 'Plastic No', which is played annually at the WI Plastic Free Picnic. CDC supports the monthly WI Green Hub by waiving its market pitch fee, where WI campaigns, along with other organisations are highlighted. The following are action months for us:

February - Show the Love, March - Ovarian Cancer, June - Great Big Green Week, July - Plastic Free Month, November - Clean Water and No More Violence Against Women and Girls.

Friday 4th December 2024 was Season's Greenings - sustainable gifts not costing the earth, festive wrapping avoiding waste plus alternative ideas and makes from salvaged/foraged home grown items were displayed on the stall.

Saturday 14th June 2025 is the annual Lavant Fete & Dog Show which is conveniently held during the Great Big Green Week where the WI Green Hub has had a presence since 2021. The whole event will be Single-Use Plastic Free and is being opened by Mary Corfield, CEO of the Climate Coalition, who are partnered with the WI. GBGW 2025: Saturday 7th June 2025 - Sunday 15th June 2025. I would love to hear from you if your WI intends to hold a Plastic Free Picnic during the 2025 Big Green Week.

The Eco-Chi group meets every Monday 10.30-12 noon at Chichester Festival Theatre Café in the Park. Chichester Transition Earth Café, open at the Friends Meeting House in Priory Road, between 11am to 1pm every Friday, and complements the Green Hub. Please contact me if you would like further information or need help in your role as a climate. Let us know what other environmental work members are doing as we need to redouble our efforts towards achieving Net Zero - as Chris Packham said "I am not going to give up on the beautiful and the good, the grip on my dreams just got tighter".

2025 OUTDOOR TALKS AND WALKS

Tuesday 20 May - A Day out in Midhurst with a look at its Tudor History

Cowdray Heritage Trust's Living History Guide will tell us about Cowdray Ruins and what Tudor life was like there, followed by a short walk to the Square in Midhurst. If the gardens are not in use for a private function, we may get a sneaky look there too! After the tour, there will be time to explore Midhurst town.

My Journey ...

The M&T team are, as you would expect a varied group, with a common aim to help and support WIs. I have asked if M&T members will occasionally write a short piece for the WSN, telling you a little about themselves and why they enjoy being an Adviser.

Here is a piece from Jacky Barugh who many of you will know:

I joined the WI just over ten years ago, after moving from West London and retiring from work. After three months, I became a member of my local WI, who made me very welcome. Two months later, I joined the Committee. After a short time, I took on the new role of President at Westergate WI.

At the start of my new role as President I was unsure of all the rules and regulations of the constitution and charity. However, five years on (and still going strong!) the Covid Pandemic (2020) hit and sadly my husband passed away.

I don't know how I would have got through this immensely difficult time without the support of all my sisters at the WI.

After that, it was as if a new chapter of my life began. I was looking to do something new. Therefore, I decided that I wanted to help and support other WI members and became an adviser. I joined the Member's Training Team. During that year, I attended meetings with other advisers and shadowed them during their visits to WI venues. I also became a member of the Public Affairs Team and a dual member of North Bersted Village.

I'll share some take-aways (healthy ones, that is) over these coming six months. Nutrition, Mindset, Healthy Ageing, Stress Management, and effective ways to age with strength and confidence without it feeling onerous.

Here's some top tips to encourage a fruitful start this February!

 Create a small window of 15 mins at the beginning of each day to plan a couple of things that you want to achieve no matter how small. Having some structure to our week helps

to keep ourselves on track during a time of year that can make us feel a bit blue. Take note of some healthy recipes with loads of veggies, quality protein (animal and/or plant), and healthy fats that you can try out. Our brains love and need omega 3 fatty acids to function well so include oily fish such as trout, mackerel and wild salmon.
